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
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


#### Farmhouse Oak Door Style

- 1) Put the T&G Boards together. Cut the ledges to about 32mm less than the finished width of the door.
- 2) Mark the position of the ledges;




3) Dismantle, leaving just 1 board. Pre drill and pin through face of board into ledges making sure they are square




4) Secret nail the first board and subsequent boards into the ledges. The last board will need to be face pinned.




5) Cut the two braces at the correct angle to give an exact fit. Either pin into place or drill and plug;



6) Mark out and drill through into the ledges



- 7) Put a little PVA glue in the hole and tap in a peg. When dry cut the peg to about 4mm proud of the ledge.
- 8) Using a chisel, with bevelled edge down, edge off the pegs;




9) Fit hardware and finish with hardwax oil.




#### Ledged and Braced Oak Door Style

There are a number of ways that these can be constructed including a full brace that is half jointed into the ledges, two braces making a double Z pattern or with two braces making a single Z shape.






- 1) Put the T&G Boards together. Cut the ledges to about 32mm less than the finished width of the door.
- 2) Mark the position of the ledges;




3) Dismantle, leaving just 1 board. Pre drill and pin through face of board into ledges making sure they are square




4) Secret nail the first board and subsequent boards into the ledges. The last board will need to be face pinned.




5) Cut the two braces at the correct angle to give an exact fit. Either pin into place or drill and plug;



6) On the face side mark out and drill through the T&G Boards into the ledges



- 7) Put a little PVA glue in the hole and tap in a peg. When dry cut the peg to about 4mm proud of the face of the door.
- 8) Using a chisel, with bevelled edge down, edge off the pegs;




9) Fit hardware and finish with hardwax oil.




#### **Battened Oak Door Style**

- 1) Assemble boards
- 2) Cut battens to about 15 20mm narrower than finished door width.
- 3) Mark out the position of the battens on the back of the door.




- 4) Clamp the panels together and stick the battens in place with double sided tape to aid handling.
- 5) Make a template for the nail holes to the same size as the top of the batten.



- 6) Mark out the nail holes on the first batten then turn pattern upside down on second batten and so on.
- 7) Drill through battens and panels with a block to avoid breakout.



8) Nail through the face with the nails aligned vertically.




- 9) Carefully tap over the end of the nail so it bends horizontally.
- 10) Trim door to size.
- 11) Fit hardware and finish with hardwax oil




#### Dovetail Oak Door Style

- 1) Assemble panels
- 2) Mark out position of dovetails and stick to panels.
- 3) The dovetails will be prepared with square holes. Drill a clearance hole through the dovetail and then pre-drill a fine hole into the T&G board.



4) Screw dovetail to panels.



- 5) Finish off the pegs as per battened doors.
- 6) Fit hardware and finish with hardwax oil.
